- Writing alone and together, with time to write and share our writing
- Exploring a wider range of journaling techniques and prompts to unleash creativity
- Working with various themes emerging from the group and forms such as creative non- fiction writing, and poetry
- Experimenting with mindfulness and embodiment in our writing-slowing down and paying attention
- Exploring how our writing reflects the volatile and changing landscape we find ourselves in and how it can nurture us and others.
